Make a list of everything you will need to buy for your wedding and budget an amount that you can afford to spend, then stick to this list and try not to go over your allotted budged.

Plan and organise your own

wedding. Wedding planners are expensive and sometimes not needed. If you feel you are in over your head, use an event coordinator for ideas and to get help with some things but do the rest on your own.

Choosing a theme can keep you focused on precisely what you want and help you avoid buying frivolous things that you might not necessarily need.

Buy a simple white dress, then buy the extras at a fabric shop and have a qualified friend add the extras with simple stitches. This can change a €500 dress into a €5,000 dress. You can also look at discount shops or sales for less expensive gowns. Same goes for buying or renting the tux or

Making the wedding a little less formal, such as a Spring wedding, can decrease the cost

Keep your invite list relatively small, mainly invite family and close friends, these are the ones who really want to be there for your special day.

Increase your flowers for the table décor and bouquets with greenery and place mirrors under the flowers on the table to increase their appearance. Have bridesmaids carry one long stemmed flower with long, flowing ribbons for their bouquets. Using in season flowers will also decrease their

Practice doing your own makeup and hair before the big day and do it on the morning of your wedding. Alternatively, find a friend who is good at this and ask for a favour.

Keep an eye out for wine sales before the wedding day. Additionally, keep an eye for sales on anything that could be useful to the wedding, i.e. invitations, flowers, favours, fabric, etc.

Having your wedding day mid-week or even on a Friday will cut the cost of your loca-

Have the photographer show up for formal shots and have a qualified friend take the

rest of the photos on a good quality camera. Photographers often charge by the hour so if you keep them there for the formal shots it will cost you a bundle less.

Book honeymoon tickets and accommodations well in advance and fly on off days, such as Monday's through Friday's rather than weekends.
